(short forms: you **don't leave**; you'll **be**)
2. She **will be** tired if she **studies** all night.
(short form: She'll **be**)
3. If they **do not hurry**, they **will miss** the bus.
(short forms: they **don't hurry**; they'll **miss**)
4. We **will sit** outside if it **is** sunny.
(short forms: we'll **sit**; it's)
5. You **will feel** better if you **drink** more water.
(short form: you'll **feel**)
6. If I **do not see** Michael, I **will call** you.
(short forms: I **don't see**; I'll **call**)
7. They **will win** the game if they **try** harder.
(short form: they'll **win**)
8. If it **rains**, we **will stay** at home.
(short form: we'll **stay**)
9. Amanda **will be** happy if she **passes** the exam.
(NB: We don't usually contract names and "will" when we write, so we don't usually write "Amanda'll".)
10. If we **leave** now, we **will not miss** the train.
(short form: we **won't miss**)
