1. They **had not finished** their homework yet. / They **hadn't finished** their homework yet.
2. I **had washed** my clothes before it started raining. / I'd **washed** my clothes before it started raining.
3. She **had** already **left** when I arrived. / She'd already **left** when I arrived.
4. We **had visited** Rome twice before moving there. / We'd **visited** Rome twice before moving there.
5. James **had made** dinner that night.
(NB: We don't usually contract nouns and "had" when we write, so we don't usually write "James'd".)
6. The dog **had not eaten** all day. / The dog **hadn't eaten** all day.
7. Ethel and I **had watched** the series twice already.
(NB: The contraction of "I had" is "I'd", but we don't usually contract it if it's with another noun, so we don't usually write "Ethel and I'd watched".)
8. Mia and Oliver **had not seen** their grandparents in years. / Mia and Oliver **hadn't seen** their grandparents in years.
9. Alice wasn't there. She **had gone** to the park. / She'd **gone** to the park.
