2. I **have washed** my clothes. / I've **washed** my clothes.
3. She **has played** tennis for ten years. / She's **played** tennis for ten years.
4. We **have studied** English for six months. / We've **studied** English for six months.
5. James **has made** dinner. / James's **made** dinner.
6. This is first time that I **have taken** the bus to work. / This is first time that I've **taken** the bus to work.
7. George and I **have watched** this series twice already.
(NB: The contraction of "I have" is "I've", but we do not usually contract it if it is with another subject, so we do not usually write "George and I've watched".)
8. Mia and Oliver **have visited** their grandparents several times this year.
(NB: We do not contract nouns and "have" when we write, so we do not write "Oliver've".)
9. Charlotte isn't here. She **has gone** to the park. / She's **gone** to the park.
